

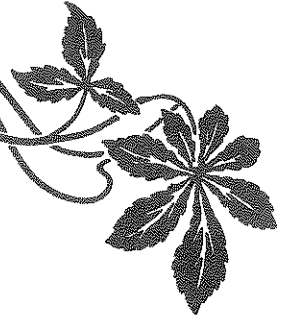

IDENTIFY THE POISON

SUMMON HELP (poison control center)

supply the following information:

- age of the victim
- kind and amount ingested
- symptoms
- when poison was swallowed
- attempts at treatment so far
- length of time to hospital

INDUCE VOMITING

except when victim has already
vomited, when he is not fully
conscious or when the
poison label says not to.

NEUTRALIZE THE POISON

20 WAYS TO PROTECT YOUR FAMILY AGAINST ACCIDENTAL POISONING

1. Don't stock up on chemicals used in gardening, painting, and home repair; buy exactly the amount you need for a job.
2. Before you bring a plant into your home, find out if it is poisonous. Warn children never to nibble on plant leaves.
3. When purchasing drugs and cleaning preparations, choose containers with child-proof caps whenever possible. And re-secure the safety device after use.
4. Store drugs and potentially dangerous products in hard-to-reach places; if possible, keep them under lock and key.
5. Keep medicines and first aid supplies out of food cabinets. Tell your children not to swallow any unknown substance.
6. Take special pains to guard tablets that are candied, flavored, or colored.

7. Keep all household products and medications in their original containers until you're ready to dispose of them.
8. Date all drug supplies when you buy.
9. Seal poisonous substances shut with strong tape when they're not in use.
10. Each time you use a drug, chemical, or other household product, carefully read the directions for safe use.
11. Don't use aerosol sprays where there's a chance they might contaminate food.
12. Replace medicine labels that are becoming illegible.
13. Don't place medications in look-alike containers side by side.
14. Before measuring doses of liquid

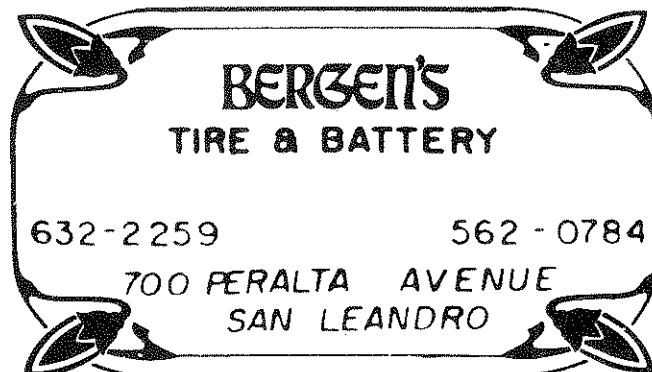
15. Never take, or give, medication in the dark, or from an unlabeled container, or when you are distracted by other matters.
16. Make it a rule to administer a prescribed medication only to the person for whom it was intended.
17. Avoid taking medicines within the sight of small children.
18. Never make a game out of administering medication to a child.
19. Throw away prescription medicine as soon as the illness for which it was prescribed is over.
20. Dispose of unwanted medicines and other possibly harmful products by pouring them down the drain or flushing them down the toilet.

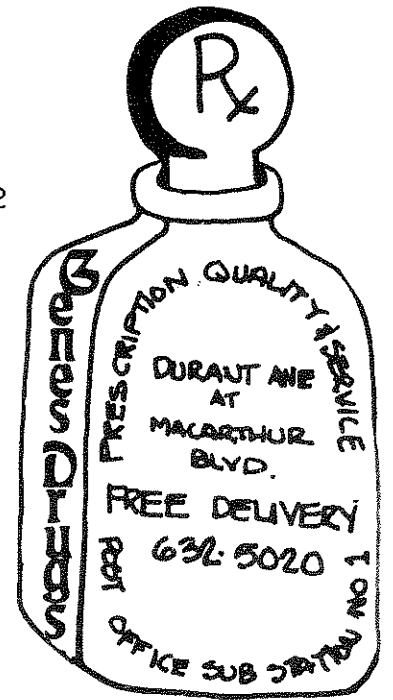

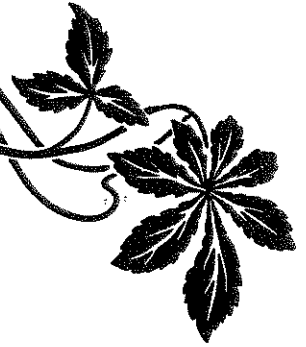

Old Business - Parks

Thinning, tree removal and spraying for infestation of the trees in Milford Park has been Completed. Parks Ch. Frank Schwartz has recommended that the Secretary write a letter to the Lion Tree Service commending them for the highly satisfactory work completed.

Parks Ch. Joyce Herzer was notified by Lion Tree Service that some cut wood has been removed from the park by homeowners. She stressed that this wood must be sprayed with lindane because of beetle infestation.

Clubhouse - Vandalism

The board discussed the problem of vandalism of the Clubhouse by youths. It was suggested that the Board try to find more groups to use the Clubhouse at night, as this is a good deterrant to gatherings by youths.

New Business

Resident Frank Stoll expressed some concerns to the Board; Park work should be done in stages to avoid high costs in a one year period. He was concerned the yearly assesments would have to be raised as a result. Pres. Karla Ball assured him the work was necessary and that the yearly fees would not be raised.

New Homeowners - Welcome kits

Directors agreed to participate in distribution of the homeowner kits in the next few weeks to new residents of Sheffield Village.

Other

The Secretary will ask Margery Gibson, candidate for the vacant City Council seat, to speak at the next Board meeting.



Home Alert News

911

On July 9, 1978, the "911" Emergency Telephone System became operational throughout Alameda County. The "911" system allows citizens to place toll-free emergency calls from any telephone directly to a "Public Safety Answering Point." The answering point for the City of Oakland is the Oakland Police Department's Communications Division. All "911" emergency calls are answered by Communications Division personnel, with emergency fire and ambulance calls automatically transferred to the appropriate public safety agency.

The "911" system should be used for emergency calls only. The non-emergency telephone number 273-3481 should continue to be used for all calls not requiring immediate police response. If any doubt exists as to the urgency of the matter in question, the "911" number should be used. Citizens are reminded however that excessive and unnecessary use of the "911" telephone number will overburden Communications personnel and hinder our ability to provide rapid emergency service.

Citizens using the "911" system will either be put through immediately to the proper public safety agency or in some cases asked to stay on the line if all reception terminals are full. An operator will then handle your call as soon as he or she becomes available. Calls are automatically handled in the order they are received to avoid any unnecessary delays.

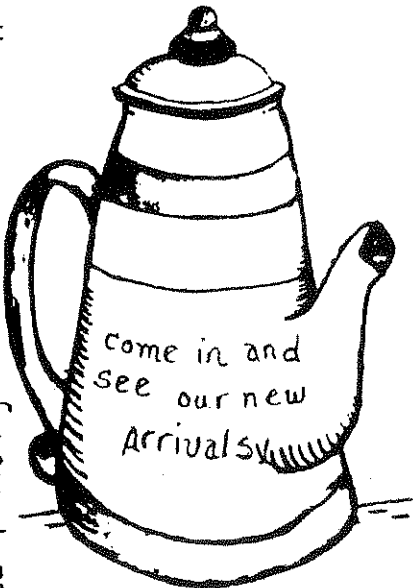

REACTION INSTRUCTIONS FOR A BURN CRISIS

| <u>ACTION</u> | <u>REASON</u> |
|--|--|
| If clothing ignited, drop to ground and roll until all flames are extinguished. NEVER RUN | Prevents flames from reaching up to face Prevents inhaling dangerous smoke Quickest way to extinguish flames |
| Get down and crawl when smoke is present | Smoke and heat rises |
| In all types of burns - gently pour cool water over burned area | Skin continues burning into deeper layers after flames or hot substance is removed |
| NEVER APPLY OTHER SUBSTANCES | May have to be removed later |
| Remove any rings, jewelry, shoes, belts, etc. | The body will begin to swell after a serious burn |
| Keep victim still and quiet, maintain body heat | Helps to prevent shock |
| If available cover burn with a clean dressing or sheet | To keep burn clean and protect from air |
| Call ambulance or the Oakland Fire Department or transport to nearest hospital | All burns require treatment. The seriousness of most burn injuries are UNDERestimated |


